History of Page, Arizona

The City of Page first started off as a housing camp in 1957 for workers building the Glen Canyon Dam, which was completed in 1963. In 1958, 24 square miles of Navajoland was traded for a larger piece in Utah needed for the construction of the dam. Glen Canyon Bridge was completed in 1959 to ease the construction of Glen Canyon Dam. Before the bridge was constructed, a 190 mile trip would be needed to get from one side of the canyon to the other. Completion of the bridge paved the way for tourism from Arizona to Utah after the dam was built.

First called "Government Camp," Page was later named in honor of John C. Page, a Bureau of Reclamation Commissioner. In the late 1950's, the community consisted of temporary homes and trailers with dirt roads carved out of the rocky and sandy landscape. As the reservoir started to fill, more people came to settle down in the area and tourists visited to enjoy beautiful Lake Powell. As the years went on, permanent housing developed as well as stores, schools, and other basic amenities.

In 1976, the Salt River Project - Navajo Generating Station opened and Page provided the workers a home. The power plant provided electricity to Arizona, Nevada, and California for 43 years before ultimately closing in 2019.

Page became an incorporated town on March 1, 1975 and is now home to over 7,000 people and welcomes millions of tourists every year.

John Wesley Powell

Lake Powell is named after John Wesley Powell. Born March 24, 1834 in New York, Powell was an explorer of the American West. In 1869, the one-armed Civil War veteran led 9 men and 4 boats on the first expedition of the Colorado River. Powell and his men embarked on a journey that covered almost 1,000 miles through the uncharted canyons and fierce rapids of the Colorado River. Powell embarked on a second expedition in 1871 and created the first maps of the area.

Lake Powell receives water mostly from the Colorado River but also from the San Juan River, Green River, and Escalante River. Lake Powell reached full pool in 1980 after completion of the dam, reaching 3,700 feet above sea level and now spans 185 miles from northern Arizona to southeastern Utah.

Lake Powell is now the second largest artificial reservoir of the United States. Spending summer vacation on Lake Powell and the Colorado River has been popular since the 1970's, tourists still come to enjoy exciting river rafting tours and cruises on the lake.

The Dine' (Navajo) have inhabited this area long before explorers like Powell ever visited. The Navajo Nation spans over 27,400 square miles in Arizona, Utah, and New Mexico making it the largest Native American reservation in the United States. The Navajo Treaty of 1868 allowed the Navajo to return to their homeland after enduring the Long Walk to Fort Sumner, New Mexico.

Almost 100 years later in 1958, 24 square miles of Navajoland was traded from the Manson family to develop the construction of Glen Canyon Dam and Bridge. Many Navajo families have deep roots and run local businesses in and around Page. All slot canyon tour companies are Navajo owned and operated, offering tours on their inherited land.

Page is rich in culture and we invite you to learn more about our history by visiting the Powell Museum & Archives. Opened in 1969, the Powell Museum & Archives showcases a wide range of exhibits covering the history of the area. From paleontology and geology, to the first residents of the plateau and birth of Page, this is the perfect place to immerse yourself in the heart of the Grand Circle.

Hiking

Whether you're interested in a short, leisurely walk or a challenging hike, Page offers many hikes for all skill levels. Remember you are in the desert, be prepared. Bring plenty of water, sunscreen, protective clothing, and wear comfortable hiking or walking shoes. Be mindful of weather and use good judgment. Temperatures can reach over 100°F / 37°C during summer months and shade can be limited or nonexistent. Avoid hiking during the hottest part of the day. Do not leave children or animals inside a vehicle, regardless of the temperature.

Please be mindful of the places you visit by practicing Leave No Trace principles

Horseshoe Bend

Horseshoe Bend (pictured above) is one of the most iconic and photographed landmarks of the Grand Circle. A parking lot just off the highway, 5 miles south of Page, and user-friendly trail makes this hike perfect for the whole family. A flat trail with a slight grade makes this hike relatively easy. Wheelchairs and strollers are welcome. Dogs are also welcome but must be on a leash. A fee payment is required to enter the parking lot. Open sunrise to sunset year round.

Distance: 1.5 Mi/2.41 Km Round Trip - Elevation Gain: 137 Ft/0.04 Km

Difficulty: Moderate - Located: Between Milepost 544 And 545 On U.S. 89



The Wave

The Wave (left) in Coyote Buttes North is magnificent sandstone carved by water and wind for thousands of years. It feels like walking in an abstract painting. 45 mi / 72 km northwest of Page, The Wave is isolated and hidden away from civilization, waiting for you to explore it. A permit is required to enter, visit recreation.gov to apply to the advanced or daily lottery.



The New Wave

The New Wave (right) is an easy alternative to if you can't make it to The Wave (above). Just outside of Page, across the Wahweap South Entrance, The New Wave is a similar sandstone formation like The Wave. The trail is a loop relatively easy and flat, great for the whole family. There isn't any signage but the path is well marked and easy to navigate.



Distance: 1.25 Mi/2.01 Km Round Trip - Elevation Gain: 100 Ft/0.03 Km

Hanging Gardens

The Hanging Gardens (left) has a well marked trail leading up to a cool and shady sandstone alcove full of vines, ferns and orchids. It makes for a fun hike for the family, leashed dogs are welcome. Wildlife thrives from the runoff water that travels down the sandstone wall. Lizards, birds, caterpillars, and even snakes can be found here. Please be mindful of wildlife and keep a safe distance.

Distance: 1.2 Mi/1.9 Km Round Trip - Elevation Gain: 62 Ft/0.01 Km
Difficulty: Easy - Located: Glen Canyon Recreation Area

Glen Canyon Dam Overlook

The Glen Canyon Dam Overlook (right) has an amazing view of the dam and of the Colorado River. Located just off US Highway 89, a short walk leads to a shaded overlook. The sandstone was carved to make stairs but is steep and can be slippery, please use the rails provided. Short lived waterfalls can be seen after rainfall and make for a unique hike.



Distance: 0.2 Mi/0.32 Km Round Trip - Elevation Gain: 39 Ft/0.01 Km

Red Mesa Rim Trail

The Red Mesa Rim Trail is Page's newest hiking and biking trail. The trail is a loop around Red Mesa and has different routes ranging in difficulty. Routes are marked green for easy, blue for intermediate, and black for difficult. A bathroom, dog waste station, and trash cans are located at the trailhead near the parkinglot. Non-motorized bikes and leashed dogs are welcome.

Distance: 11 Mi/17.7 Km Round Trip - Ranges in difficulty

Rim View Trail

The Rim View Trail, also called the Page Loop, is a 10.3mi loop around Manson Mesa with vast views of Page's surrounding areas. Hike any part of the loop to find scenic views. Mountain bikes and leashed dogs are welcome, dog waste station and trash cans are located along the trail. Motorized vehicles, scooters, skateboards, and horses are prohibited on the trail.

Distance: 10.3 Mi/16.5 Km Round Trip - Elevation Gain: 475 Ft/0.14 Km



Swimming

Swimming in Lake Powell and the Colorado River is a great way to cool off and escape the summer heat. You can't find a better place to spend your summer. Please take caution, there aren't lifeguards at any of these locations and cell service is spotty.

Wahweap Beach

A soft sand beach in Wahweap Marina. A peaceful area to relax and sunbathe. Bathrooms, dining, and convenience stores nearby. A pass is required to enter.

Antelope Point

Red rock cliffs located in Antelope Point Marina. A great spot for cliff jumping, fishing, and water toys. Swim across to Antelope Island and enjoy the sandy beach. A pass is required to enter.

The Chains

The closest swimming area near Page. Red rock cliffs perfect for cliff jumping and fishing. Enjoy the view of Glen Canyon Dam and Bridge. A pass is not required to enter.

Paria Beach

A rocky beach in Lee's Ferry on the Colorado River with amazing views of Glen Canyon. Plenty of nearby hikes and a lonely ranch with an orchard. Amenities nearby. A pass is required to enter.

Lone Rock Beach

A calm and sandy beach with lots of room to have fun. A great spot to camp, fish, sunbathe, and bring water toys. High clearance, 4x4 vehicles are recommended. Do not enter muddy areas. A pass is required to enter.

We recommend buying an annual 'America the Beautiful' pass to cover entrance fees for national parks and recreation sites across America






